# A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

I hope you will find our second newsletter of interest and my thanks to all who have helped with its delivery.

Crime and fear of crime is of concern to all of us. All too frequently residents talk to me about crime and suspicious activities that, quite often, have not been reported to the Police. The main reason given is 'What's the point nothing ever happens'. Many crimes, often drug related, are committed by a relatively small number of people who need to be caught. Please look at crime as being a jigsaw puzzle. All the information you give fits in somewhere. As the puzzle nears completion the Police are more likely to get a successful prosecution and that makes for more efficient use of their resources. The number to ring is 08458 505505 but please remember to ask for the Windsor PEC (Police enquiry centre) to speak to the local Police as the initial call will be answered at a Thames Valley Police Central Operations Centre. Also our regular Parish Police Surgeries at the Parish Office allow the added facility of face to face contact with a local Police Officer.

Our last Newsletter gave details of our expenditure. This was reviewed in January when we are required to inform the Royal Borough of our precept requirement for the following financial year. Following the sale of land many years ago we have had healthy reserves. We have reduced these over the years as required by the Audit Commission, using the money to offset past rises in the precept. We are now down to an acceptable level of reserves being approximately 50% of our precept. The cost of services the Parish Council has to provide has risen; several projects are under active consideration and as a result we have applied to the Roval Borough to increase our precept by £5.82 per year based on a Band D property.

Overleaf we give details of a sponsored fund raising walk to help towards the re-building costs of Holyport Youth Club & Pre-School Building, replacing the one destroyed by fire. This facility really is needed as soon as possible for use by our youth so do please support and enjoy the event with family and friends.

through some attractive countryside. A map showing all Rights of Way can be obtained from the Parish Office free of charge. We aim to keep these rights of way usable and clear of obstruction, so any problems please inform the Parish Office. We also have available a leaflet promoting a Health Walk around Holyport produced in conjunction with the Borough Council and giving some history of landmarks along the route. The Parish Council has recently carried out drainage work and path improvements to the area from Bourne Bridge to Pamela Row on Holyport Green and new horse matting has been installed to help horse riders negotiate the former boggy areas in safety.
